1. (1) **Backpack** (**NO** rolling backpacks please) \*Label
2. (1) **Lunchbox** \*Label
3. (4) **Folders** - paper- with pockets on the bottom \*Label on the outside; top left corner.
4. (4) Large (0.77 oz) **Glue Sticks**
5. (1) **Ruler 12"** Must have in. and cm. on it. \*Label  
NOT CLEAR. Would prefer it if had the #0 on both the cm & inch. sides  
(Fiskars or Westcott are good choices.)
6. (1) **Scissors** (child size) Be sure they are comfortable if your child is left-handed
7. (3) **Erasers** (pink or white)
8. (6) At least 6 #2 **Pencils** (Pentech makes great wooden pencils!)
9. (1) Spare pair of **Underpants and Socks** in a plastic zip bag  
(in case of accidents) \*Label
10. (1) **Supply Box SpaceMaker Stretch** - size 13" x 5-1/4" x 2-1/2"  
(Should be able to find at Staples or Target). \*Label  
This is important as it must be able to fit a ruler inside!
11. **Twistable crayon by Crayola** 12 is really all that they need
